#### DO A BETTER JOB OF LOOKING AFTER OUR GOLF COURSE

Once again it appears there are a number of golfers who either don't know how to repair their ball marks on the greens, or choose not to. Its hard to know whether these people are members or green fee players. Whoever they are they should know better. Every green I walk on I end up repairing at least 3 ball marks which can be anything from a large hole where someone has flown a ball in from a distance, to a small pitch or skid mark from chipping or skipping a ball on the green. The rule of thumb for ball marks is as follows: Fix your own mark, as well as at least **one other**. While I'm at it, another thing that appears to be ignored is the raking of the traps. Today I was in one trap where it was very apparent whoever was there before me figured it wasn't their job. You could see every footprint where they walked in and out and you could clearly see where they hit the ball out of the sand. Rule of thumb regarding traps - rake it so it is better than it was before you went into it. To rake it properly, you need to use two hands and rake it level; one handed raking is lazy and just doesn't do a good job (although its better than what I experienced today). The maintenance crew usually go around each morning and try to repair ball marks and rake traps - however, they have plenty else to do and if players would do what they are supposed to do, it would give them more time to get to other jobs in the mornings. As the editor of this newsletter and a Director of the club, I recommend to players/members that if you see someone failing to do these chores, go ahead and tell them about it (politely hopefully). Perhaps if the message gets out there at least some of these nuisance items won't continue.

#### **GROUNDS REPORT**

I hope everyone is enjoying the mild winter, this is making up for last winters long periods of course closures & allowing for some good winter golf days. We are having a lot of golfers on the course these days & it shows, with the greens being as soft as they are there are a lot of ball marks, many of which are not being repaired. The grounds crew fix as many ball marks as they can in the mornings but this uses time that could be better off spent on other things on the course, please take the time to properly repair ball marks you make or see on the greens.

The first phase of the Cowichan Valley Trail along the golf course is almost complete, all that is left is the addition of new trees. There will be over 30 conifores planted in areas where errant shots may come in contact with people using the trail. Chemainus Rotary is a big contributor for purchasing the trees & Mt. Brenton G.C. will help with the planting & any necessary watering of the trees. A grand opening for this first phase of the Cowichan Valley Trail is slated for late March 2010.

The washrooms near #5 Tee will soon be getting a facelift inside, this will consist of painting the floors & adding some new fixtures. Other work we are planning on doing in the near future is the addition to & the leveling of some Tees, first on the list is #17 Tee. We will also be continuing with the aeration & sand topdressing of our older fairways this coming spring. We have set the date for this work to coincide with the greens aeration, starting Monday, April 19th.
